CET3 Clifford Truman Mullen, Vietnam Veteran, Native of Benton, Missouri.

CET3 Construction Electrician (Telephone) Third Class Clifford Truman Mullen was a casualty of the Vietnam War. As a member of the Navy, CET3 Mullen served our country until January 3rd, 1969 in Quang Nam, South Vietnam. He was 21 years old and was not married. It was reported that Clifford died from an undetermined accident. His body was recovered. Clifford was born on July 20th, 1947 in Benton, Missouri. CET3 Mullen is on panel 35W, line 028 of the Vietnam Memorial Wall in Washington D.C. He served our country for 2 years.

It has been 40 years since that horrible day at the Burn Unit at Fort Sam Houston, but I remember every moment. When the call came in November, I thought it would all work out but it would not have been fair to have you live in such pain. The short time we had was wonderful - from you hopping into our car, then the first kiss, and eventual relationship. My one regret was that you came to my college graduation on the day you left, when we could have spent time together. I have lived another life after you left me; but my husband, children, and grandchildren know all about you. Since my marriage did not last, proved to me that you were "THE ONE". Luckily with the emotions and feelings you taught me, Terry and I were able to get along and have a good life for our children. Our Memorial Day's have always been dedicated to you; and I have had three children and one grandchild play taps over 18 years at our local Memorial Day event and each one knows that it is for you. Also when two of my children went to Washington DC (at different times), both took the time to go to the wall and take a picture of you (your name) for me.
