

**James Arthur Savage/Johnson  
Born in Saint Louis, MO May 10, 1880  
Died January 10, 1924  
Father: Believed to be James Davis Savage  
Mother: Catherine Chamderlain  
Married to Lizzie Trinkler ABT 1902**

## **Records in hand**

- Arthur Johnson died January 10, 1924 and was buried in New Bethleham, MO.
- The 1910 Census list the same family under Arthur Johnson instead of James Arthur Savage. All estimated ages are within the right period and his Mother Catherine Johnson is living with them so it appears as there is a name change. However, the 1918 Registration card still indicates Savage. They have four additional children, Marion 9, Iva 6, Arthur 3 and Jasper L. Johnson as 6/12<sup>th</sup>. We have pictures with information referring to Lizzie's name as Savage and Johnson. We also have pictures of Jasper L. Johnson with our other family members. Buela is not listed here and she would have only been 10. One possible guess is that maybe Marion and Buela are one and the same. Since they appear to remain under a different identity.
- 12/6/1918 Lizzie is listed as James Savage's wife on his Registration card.
- 1902 James Arthur Savage gets a divorce from Margaret Hilbert. James did not appear in court for the divorce as the divorce was over his affair with Lizzie Trinkler. It appears that James Arthur Savage hid from the court

**and moved to Venice, ILL and marries Lizzie Trinkler.  
In addition, they both are now known as the Johnsons.**

- **1900 census there is a Catherine Johnson listed as head of household and she has her son James Arthur Savage, Lizzie Trinkler and Lizzie's infant baby 0/12 living with her. Lizzie is shown as 20 years old. Our assumption is that Lizzie is Louisa, however her given census age may be closer to her sister Christina Trinkler. But all ages are taken from census which are not always correct.**
- **James Arthur Savage Married Margaret Hilbert around 1898.**
- **November 1880 census for Kate Savage as head of household with son James as 6 months old which we list his birth as May 10, 1880 in Saint Louis, MO.**
