- 1914 obituary in Saint Louis paper
- Missouri state death certificate 3311 Klein Street Saint Louis, MO March 20, 1914 reported by Kate Trinkler
- 1910 April 1910 Census, Charles Trinkler, lived on 3311 Klien Street Saint Louis, MO with Kate Trinkler and their daughter Irene age 13 and son Leo A. Wininger age 29. Married 25 years.
- Could not find Charles on the June 1900 census with wife Catherine (Kate) Trinkler.
- Fredericka Trinkler (Charles wife before Kate) dies on August 13, 1887 at 3203 n 6th street Saint Louis, MO
- No record but if you go by the census Catherine and Charles got married about 1884.
- No record of a divorce from Fredericka, however, there is a record of a birth of Kate Trinkler May 9, 1884 to George (believe to be an Uncle to Charles and who they lived with in 1880) and Fredericka. Assumption is that Charles and Fredericka got a divorce.

- After the 1880 Census, Charles and Fredericka had another child Nettie Trinkler January 28, 1882.
- June 1880 census, Charles Trinkler, lived on 3203 2nd Street Saint Louis, Mo with George Trinkler 1831 49 years old (believed to be Uncle of Charles), Katherine Smith 21 years old, her son George Smith 6 years old, Charles wife Henrika 31 years old, Charles/Henrika's Children, George age 13, Christine age 8, Rosine age 6 and Louisa age 1.
- Charles Trinkler served in two Union militia units during the civil war. He was noted as Charles Trankler of the 5th Missouri Cavalry and then as Charles Trankler of the 4th Missouri Cavalry. He enlisted in St. Louis and was present for some roll calls but eventually was considered a deserter. There is no record of Charles or his widow ever filing for a pension. Possibly due to his desertion from service.
- 1870 census Kate Trenkler (mother) believed to be Chatarine Trenkler age 36 who immigrated to Saint Louis, MO from Weimar, Germany via way of Bremen through New Orleans, LA. It also appears that she is the mother of Charles (although he is no longer in the home at time of census), Christiane 18 years old and Kate 13 years old.
- 1860 time frame Fredericka/Henrika Lumonstom would have married Charles Trinkler.
- Accounted for all passengers listed on the Empire City with exception of Gabriel and daughter Catharine.
- June 12, 1855 SS Empire City's passenger list shows a Gabriel and Margareta Trenkler family. With other records and some assumptions we believe the following:

- Option 1; Gabriel and Margareta Trenkler were husband and wife with;
 - Daughter Johannes age 25.
 - Son George age 21
 - Daughter Catharine age 18
 - Daughter in law Rosetle Trenkler age 38.
 - Her daughter Christine age 10.
 - Daughter in law Chatarine (Catherine) age 36. Her son Carl (Charles) age 11.
 - Her daughter Christiane age 4
- Option 2; Gabriel and Margareta Trenkler were husband and wife with;
 - Daughter Johannes age 25.
 - Son George age 21
 - Daughter Catharine age 18
 - Sister in law Rosette Trenkler age 38.
 - Her daughter Christine age 10.
 - Sister in law Chatarine (Catherine) age 36.
 - Her son Carl (Charles) age 11.
 - Her daughter Christiane age 4
- Option 1 and 2 assumes that either Gabriel's brothers or older sons and went ahead of the family to find their new home in Saint Louis, MO. For this to be his sons, they would have had at least a 10 year span between these two that went ahead and the three that was with them.
